

Many major questions about the Bible's Book of Mark, the oldest written gospel, remain, but some essential clarity on its nature, purpose, and meaning can now be attained on the basis of the last century's far-reaching scholarship and reflection. This scholarly work takes previous research to a new level, arguing that the author of the gospel of Mark wrote this text primarily to be a kind of revelational book (and not a biography, for example), with scriptural writings, particularly the Septuagint, as his model and inspiration. Knowing this is essential for a coherent interpretation of the gospel. Topics taken up include the meaning of scripturality, canonicity, and authorship in a biblical setting; the notion of revelation; features of septuagintal genres, styles, and discourses; other approaches to the genre of Mark's gospel; and the possible uses and provenance of this text. Biblical scholars will find here a wide range of advanced study synthesized to make a new breakthrough on some critical long-standing questions about the gospel. Though some foreign-language scholarship is cited in the original languages, the substance of this work is fully accessible to English-speakers. Any students of the gospels will find this study a helpful overview of and introduction to contemporary Marcan research.
